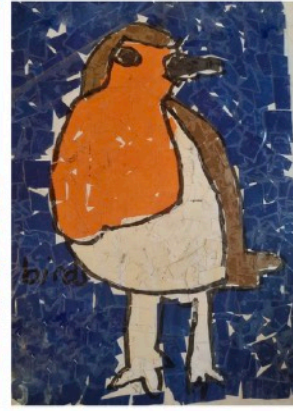
From KS1 to KS4 our art clubs are tailored to ensure all students improve their artistic skills.

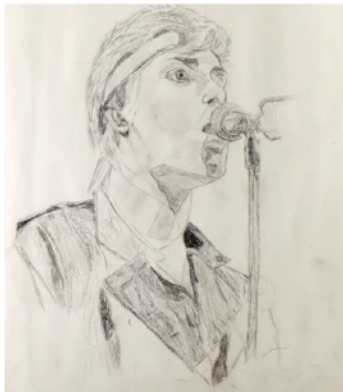

EXAMPLE OF A TERM PROJECT

PROJECT: CARTOON/ANIMATED CHARACTERS 1950s TO PRESENT DAY

The aim of this project is for the students to learn about the history of cartoon characters taking them on a fascinating journey that reflects the evolution of animation, technology, and culture.

Using simple colours and shapes to create their work, they will end up with a finished poster by the end of the course.

Materials used: Pencils, Colour pencils, Acrylic paint, canvas, paper

Week 1 - Introduction to materials

Week 2 - Golden age of animation: 1920s-1960s

Week 3 - Looney Tunes (1930s-1950s) Learning how to sketch various characters

Week 4 - Simpsons characters

Week 5 - Nintendo and Pixar characters

Week 6 - Exploring acrylic paint as a medium

Week 7 - Pre planning of final composition

Week 8 - Sketching final composition using techniques learned

Week 9 - Painting final composition

Week 10 - Painting final composition

Each week the club will start with a warm up activity and there will be a fact of the day. There will be a memory recall about the previous week's fact. This is a great way to start the lesson and get everyone engaged before the activity of the day begins.
